Bombay Seacoast</u></b> has sponsored 14 Drop outs for a 6 month Vocational Training at YMCA in Mobile Phone Repairing, Wiring, Electrical Maintenance, Sewing, Embroidery &amp; Beauty treatment.</li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C. Bombay</u></b> has started educational Toy Libraries – Vocational Training at Remand Home, provided Note books, Text books to the Slum Children, started Janshikshan Abhiyan – English speaking classes at Ambedkar Municipal School and another Municipal School in Colaba – a much talked about project, organized Drawing competitions, Vermiculture workshop, Vocational training to Self Help Groups, provided LCD Camera for visual instruction to encourage writing, plans to donate Training Boat for Sea Cadets Training other than the various vocational Training courses given to the deserving candidates in the 2 vocational Training Centres at YMCA run by R.C. Bombay.</li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C Mumbai Shivaji Park</u></b> sponsored 8 members for job oriented course on Hospitality at the catering college. <b>A Partnership Project on <u>Yoga and Health</u> among Rotary International District 3140, Kaivalyadhama Institute, Lonavala , Times Foundation and Yoga Association of India was suggested to all Clubs which will serve as an excellent opportunity and great help for all those who wish to take up <u>Yoga as their vocation.</u></b></li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C. Bombay Midcity</u></b> are carrying out Tailoring classes for 20 children with their mothers at Pragati Kendra, Worli.</li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C. Sealand</u></b> are sponsoring 50 students at Colaba Municipal School</li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C. Bombay North</u></b> conducted training for Stitching and Mehndi to 25 Candidates.</li> <li>❖ <b><u>R.C. Bombay Worli</u></b> is giving training for making Leather Goods.</li> </ul>

- ❖ **R.C. Bombay Pier** – plans to train youngsters in physical security management and thereafter help them in securing appropriate jobs in the Security.
- ❖ **R.C. Bombay Queens Necklace** – targeted for vocational training to 250 girls.
- ❖ **R.C. Bombay Harbour** plans to train candidates from Colaba Municipal School and the Fishermans Colony.
- ❖ **R.C. Dombivli Uptown** has organized educational programmer for 6 candidates
- ❖ **R.C. Dombivli Downtown** has sponsored 80 women for Pot & Fabric Painting, Mehendi & Bridal Make-up
- ❖ **R.C. Hiranandani Estate** is planning for electrician course for 25 boys at Ganeshpuri.
- ❖ **R.C. Thane Central** has provided Micro-finance of Rs. 25000/ for SELF HELP GROUP OF tribal women in GANESHPURI. Provided vocational training of beautician course to 27 tribal women from 15 villages.
- ❖ **R.C. Thane North** organized Tailoring course for 10 girls at Mumbra, Two Wheeler course for 15 deaf & dumb for a period of 6 Months and has also lined up for a Screen Printing course for 6 Candidates.
- ❖ **R.C. Thane North End** runs a vocational centre for special children.
- ❖ **R.C. Palghar** has organized **Power Tiller Repairs Training Project** wherein the youth will get an opportunity to learn and farmers will get timely assistance in mending the broke down tractors thus won't miss the season. They also plan to give basic training in Welding, Turning, Plumbing etc. to the tribal youth who are absolutely deprived of any such training as even ITI requires minimum SSC passed still there are no vacancies for admissions.
- ❖ **R.C. Mumbai Dahisar** has completed a Mobile Repairing course for 15 children at Shantinagar slum for which written and practical exams have already been conducted. They plan to start a second batch soon. They also plan to organize Advance Stitching Course for 20 girls.
- ❖ **R.C, Dombivli Uptown** giving education to 6 labor class candidates.
- ❖ **R.C. Thane Central** organized beautician course for 25 women at Vajreshwari.
- ❖ **R.C, Thane Lake City** residentified place to organize training course with JSS.
- ❖ **R.C. Dombivli North** plans to help poor children more than 200 in education with the help of DDF.
- ❖ **R.C. Deonar** has conducted first batch of vocational training with 25 ladies in tailoring at Matoshri Vidya Mandir along with Jan Shikshan Abhiyanhas. Also presented Tailoring kits to the ladies undergoing vocational training
- ❖ **R.C. Thane Hills** conducted a career guidance program on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 09 at Vasant Vihar High School for the 9th class students. There were a total of 350 students and 10 teachers in attendance. Aubrey Rebello, Dr. Vijay Kulkarni, Sanjiv Seth, Samir Pradhan, Ann. Anita Satish and Sachin Jog were present. Also had the Q & A session. On 23<sup>rd</sup> December 09, conducted the second program of the season for the class 11th students of the Vasant Vihar High School.
