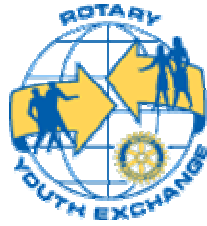


Rotary Youth Exchange

Objective of the Committee	:	<p>The district RYE committee functions in coordination with clubs to facilitate smooth transition for both the inbounds & outbounds. As our district is a signatory to a zero tolerance policy, the guidelines prescribed are strictly adhered to. In event of non-compliance by a club, the club is liable to be banned from further participation in the programme.</p> <p>The objectives of the program are:</p> <p>International Goodwill and understanding To further international goodwill and understanding by enabling students to study, some of the problems and accomplishments of people in lands other than their own.</p> <p>Education To enable students to advance their education by studying for a year, in an environment entirely different to their own and undertaking study of courses and subjects not normally available to them in schools in their own country.</p> <p>Ambassadors To enable students to act as ambassadors for their own country by addressing Rotary Clubs, Community Organizations and Youth Groups in their host country and by imparting as much knowledge as they can, of their own country and its problems, to the people they meet during their year abroad.</p> <p>Broaden Outlook To enable students to broaden their own outlook by learning to live with and meet people of different cultures, creeds and colours other than their own, and by having to cope with day-day to-day problems in an environment completely different to the one they have experienced at home.</p> <p>Observation To enable students to study and observe different facets of life and culture in the country where they are hosted so that on their return to their home country, they can share the knowledge they have gained by addressing Rotary Clubs, Youth Groups and Community Organizations.</p>
What Clubs should do?	:	<p>Under the leadership of a club Youth Exchange Officer, clubs should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • identify high schools and/or local community organizations to tell teenagers about the opportunities in the Youth Exchange program, • meet with interested students and their parents, and interview the students to determine their suitability for the program. • Clubs are urged to invite their outbound candidates to one or more Rotary meetings before the student leaves, to help them

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	<p>learn more about Rotary and the sponsoring club.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Outbound students should be given a few club banners to exchange overseas. <p>Applications are to be downloaded from the website around October. The placements will be decided at the time of interviews around January/February. The entire process is completed by April to enable students to leave beginning June.</p> <p>For the inbound students, the club is responsible for identifying host families and arranging for schooling, in addition to providing the student with a monthly allowance & pay for one language class(Hindi/English) plus one cultural activity. Ideally, there should be three or four different host families through the year, so the student gets to enjoy a variety of experiences.</p> <p>Families also get to enjoy the student, and no one family is overburdened. The club must get approval from a local high school for the student's enrollment, and that information, along with the identity of the first host family, must be submitted to the District YE Committee at least three months before the student's arrival.</p> <p>Schedule one of the District Youth Exchange committee members as a speaker for the club, and start talking about hosting an inbound student next year (those arrangements need to be made several months in advance, so it's never too early)</p> <p>Make a world of difference to the youth. Participate in RYE today.</p>
